
IT'S WAR FOR WYRE

DOING LOTS IN DARWEN

This term in Darwen, we have covered a range of topics in Statistics. Pupils have been gathering information in a tally chart and then presenting it in a series of different graphs.

In English we are working our way through the reading books on Active Learn. Some pupils have been moving up more than 1 level every week! Pupils have been identifying and correcting mistakes in their own work.

In science we have been looking at using electrical appliances in the classroom. Pupils can now construct an electrical component from scratch knowing what components to use to light a bulb or work a motor.

In PE, pupils have been able to safely and correctly use the fitness room equipment and have designed a 30 minute fitness programme using 6 pieces of equipment, all machines wiped down in between of course!

We also spent a fab morning at Forest School making tents, being outdoors, working as a team and co-operating with each other to achieve a common goal.

ONLINE SAFETY GROUP

The Online Safety group have been working hard this term during their meetings. We have been discussing lots of different strategies for staying safe online. We have also been sending out a weekly message to help others stay safe.

As we approach Christmas we have been looking at the different gifts that could be on many young people's Christmas lists and what people should know about them. Parent Zone have put together a comprehensive article to outline some of the 'must haves' this year. A firm favourite this year are the new consoles that have just been released: The Sony Playstation 5 and the X box Series X (both RRP £449).



Both feature higher speeds, responsiveness and loading times – plus ultra HD graphics, as you might expect from next-generation consoles.

Both were released in November and have become the most desirable of all this year's new gadgets – so much so that stocks are regularly selling out and opportunists are using bots to buy up what remains.

What do you need to know before you buy?

- XBox X and PS5 games aren't cheap blockbuster titles can cost £70+
- Don't pay over the odds resellers are doubling prices for desperate shoppers
- Both consoles work better connected online, so check all new account settings for purchases, privacy and in-game chat to suit your child's age

What are the potential risks?

In-game purchases and loot boxes are increasingly used in many online games and children can quickly be parted with cash. In-game chat can also expose children to strangers, so make sure you are aware of the settings. Also be aware of PEGI ratings and what games are suitable for your child.




INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

- Search for MyEd on Google Play or App Store (depending on your phone/tablet).
- When you open the app, search for Pendle Community High School & College
- Next, you will be asked to input your full name, your mobile number and your email address. All of this information must match exactly with the information we hold for you. If it does not, you will still get access to school and college news, calendar etc. However, you will not receive information/data about your son/daughter.

Once you have entered your details, you will be sent a verification code via text message. Input this code when prompted on the MyEd app and vou are all set!

· Pupil data will synchronise overnight.

The EU Settlement Scheme has been set up to provide immigration status to those who need it as the UK leaves the EU. It is therefore important that everyone that needs to applies. The EU Settlement Scheme has been designed with European Economic Area (EEA) citizens and their representatives to be simple and straightforward. It will be looking for reasons to grant, not for reasons to refuse.

The Scheme opened on 30 March 2019 and applications must be made by June 2021. It is free to make applications to the Scheme.
