# **CASHLESS SCHOOL**

As all parents/carers are aware, we have implemented our online payments system, ParentPay. So far 81% of our families have signed up and are using the system. We would like to encourage the remaining 19% of families to sign up as we are no longer able to accept cash payments in school. If you send in cash from January, your cash payment may be returned home with a letter about how you can pay online. Please contact the school office if you are struggling to access your account.

Making a payment is straightforward and ParentPay holds a payment history for you to view at a later date; no card details are stored in any part of the system. Once you have activated your account you can make online payments straight away.

Online payments are available for school dinners, trips and events, clubs, even for donations for fundraising events.
